

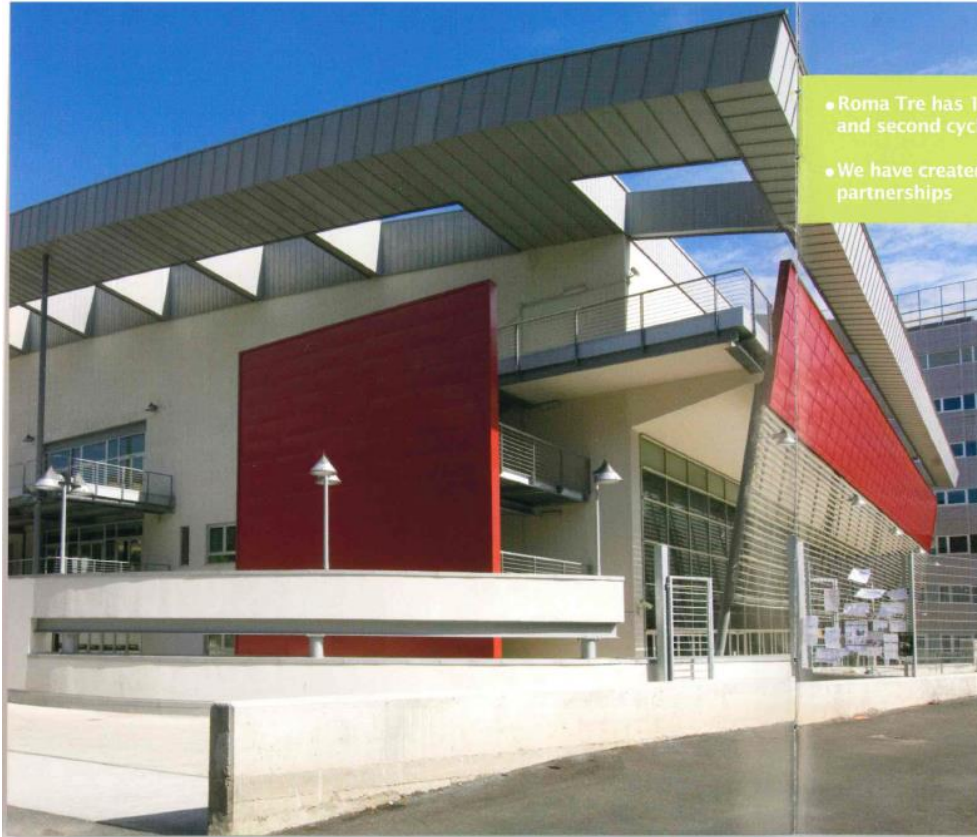

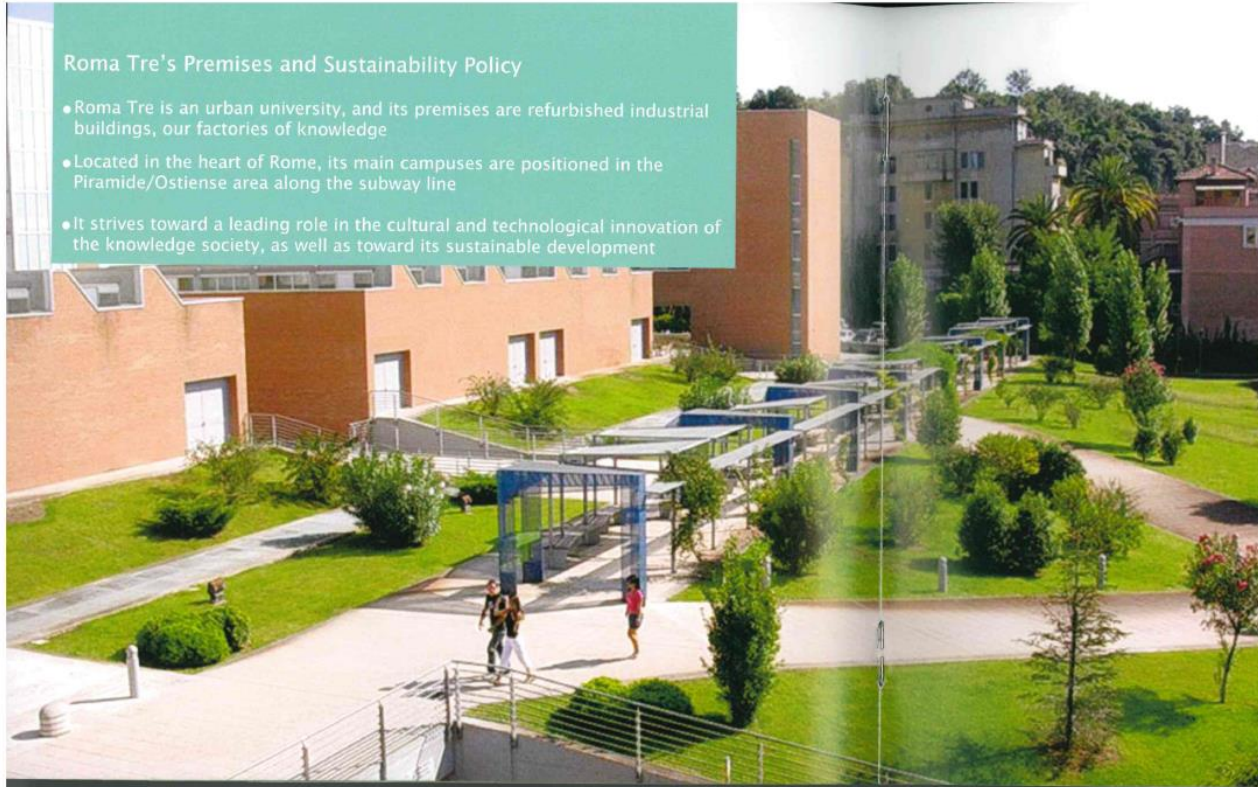

Roma Tre's Premises and Sustainability Policy

- Roma Tre is an urban university, and its premises are refurbished industrial buildings, our factories of knowledge
- Located in the heart of Rome, its main campuses are positioned in the Piramide/Ostiense area along the subway line
- It strives toward a leading role in the cultural and technological innovation of the knowledge society, as well as toward its sustainable development



- The architectural structures of its premises – old and discontinued plants in the city transformed into factories of ideas and knowledge –, famous for their extraordinary aesthetics, have modified the surrounding territory, bringing urban value to the entire quadrant, synthesising complementarities between form and substance and becoming attractive meeting points for students and Rome inhabitants

- And the winner is: RhOME for denCity! Italy is world champion in Sustainable Architecture within the Solar Decathlon 2015, an international competition organized by the U.S. Department of Energy in which universities from all over the world meet to design, build and operate a home energy self-sufficient, thanks to the use of solar energy, and equipped with all the technologies useful for maximizing efficiency

- In the field of sustainable mobility, Roma Tre offers its students a fleet of bicycles as well as a variety of car sharing, car pooling and smart mobility devices in cooperation with the Municipality and various companies

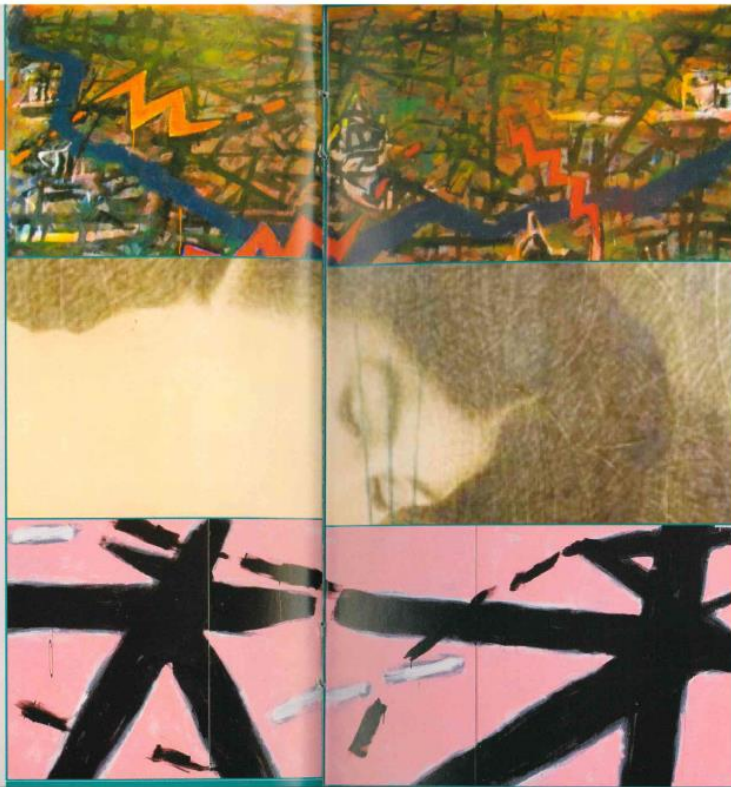

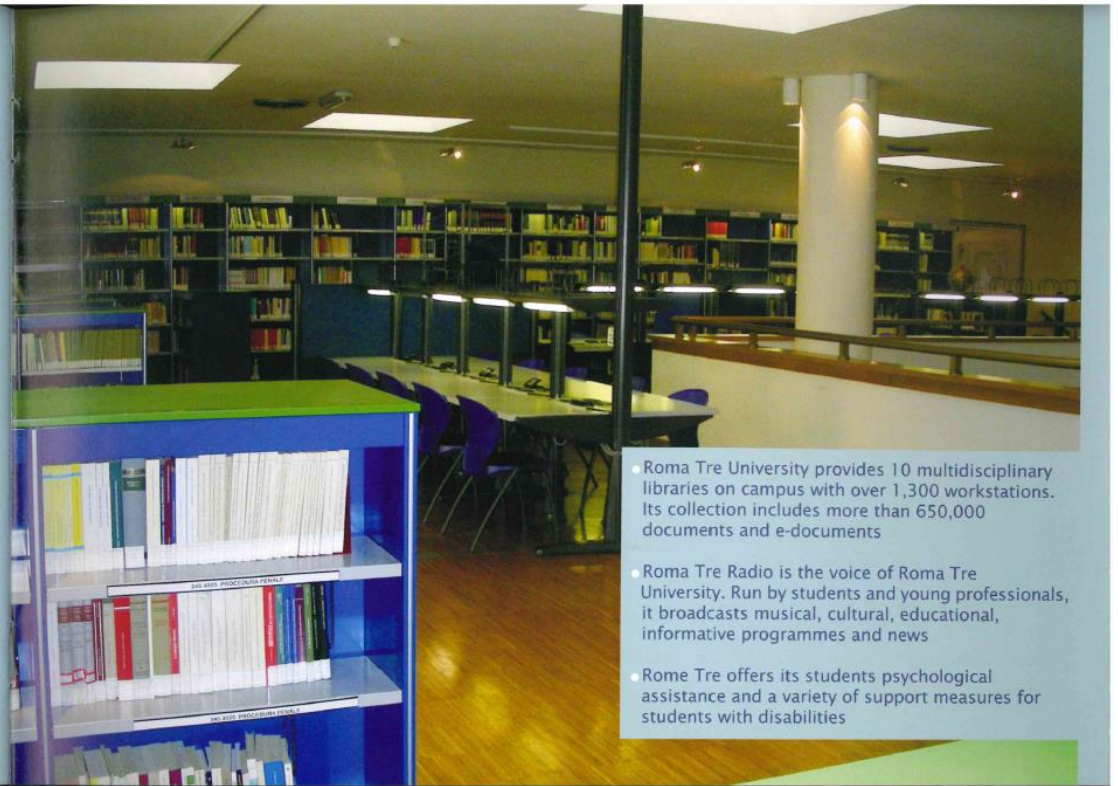
Sports at Roma Tre
